I'd also like to feel part of a team. If all the normal figures were provided it is not inconceivable I might haave a useful observation or two. I am very puzzled why there is nothing to get one is teeth into. I kept all the secrets of TNL on the board for 14 years and for the last year as chairman of the executive of the Sunday =Times (when we planned a  $17\frac{1}{2}$  per cent ad.rate increase in autumn 1981 and the 40 p price increase in October).

I'm not, in sho t, saying anything about editorial independence but generally about how we can all efficiently help this great enterprise stay on tourse.
